On Sunday, October 13, we will begin to offer two worship services every Sunday. The first one will be at 8:30 a.m. and the second will be at 10:45 a.m. Sunday School will be in between the two services at 9:45 a.m. This will be a big change for our church. It is something that we have been praving about for a long time. Why are we doing this? We have been becoming more and more crowded in our sanctuary for a while now. In order to facilitate more arowth, we need to open up more space. Having two services is the only way we can do that at this time.

We have hired an architectural and consulting firm named Station 19. Station 19 is going to help us get a vision for how we can maximize the use of our current building. They may also give us some ideas on possible expansion of our facility.

I am confident that the Lord will help us to do exactly what we need to do, exactly when we need to do it.

LEADERSHIP MEETING

September 3, 2024: Leadership Teams Notes

The leadership team met September 3 to review the Station 19 contract received post congregational approval to move forward. Present at the meeting were: Terry Silverberg, Pastor Dan Pearson, Brenda Cogbill, Lucas Carlson, Susie Thayer, Emily Johnson and Cindee McBride. Tim Jurisch (not present) provided comments to Lucas prior to the meeting. Lucas called the meeting to order. Pastor prayed. Terry led walking us through the contract. There is a correction to our understanding—Workshop 4 is \$6000.00 not \$8000.00. The schematic design is \$8,000.00. Emily motioned to accept Tim's review. Brenda seconded. Motion to accept Tim's review passed. Lucas motioned to accept the contract. Emily seconded. Motion carried. There was further discussion about pre-work which Susie will complete and submit by 9/9.

September 9, 2024: Leadership Team Notes

Present: Terry Silverberg, Pastor Dan Pearson, Brenda Cogbill, Lucas Carlson, Jacob Peterson, Susie Thayer, Matt Thayer, Burt Beebe, Tim Jurisch and Cindee McBride.

Call to Order, Devotions and Prayer. Lucas called the meeting to order. Brenda led devotions from the Purpose Drive Life referencing James 3:18; Acts 2:42 focused on developing community and that only the Holy Spirit can cultivate true community. True community takes honesty, humility, courtesy. Brenda prayed.

Agenda and last month's meeting minutes. Terry motioned to accept; Emily seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

Youth Report (reproduced here) was submitted via email by youth pastor Josh Williamson. Emily motioned to accept. Burt seconded. Motion passed.

From Josh via email: I am very excited to kick off our new school year with Sunday School and CREW on Wednesday nights. Please be in prayer specifically for two things.

First, on Wednesday nights we are going through the Alpha youth series and I am already aware of some friends that have been invited that do not know Jesus. Please be praying for our youth to continue inviting their friends that they might learn about the love of Jesus and start a relationship with Him.

Second, our Sunday School class is going to be discussing and studying what the Bible teaches related to questions submitted by our youth. Our first week someone suggested we study "what is the unforgivable sin?" I am excited to see what other questions the youth submit throughout the year. Please be praying that our discussions and studies are God honoring and life giving.

Also, I am looking for more suggestions for our youth volunteer days if anyone knows of any needs in our community. A name was given to me recently of someone who really could use some help around their yard, and so I

was able to reach out to them and asked if we could bless them in this way and it took them by surprise, but they were happy to accept the offer. In October, I am hoping to complete the renovation of the community church sign on highway 63.

I have also recently met with some of the area churches and youth pastors and on October 19th we will be coordinating an Underground Church event in Clayton with five other area churches. We have invited Noah Burnett from Stumbling Saints to join us for a time of worship as well. It's expected to be the largest Underground Church event we've ever had in our area!

Financial report for August. It was brought forward that Pastor's health insurance has sent a notification of change. Cindee will review and bring changes to the leadership meeting next month. There was also a review of designated funds and a discussion about having emergency funds—said items to be discussed during the 2025 budgeting meeting. Motion by Cindee to accept. Seconded by Emily. Motion passed with no objections.

Old Business.

• Food Trailer usage. Amery FFA has not responded to our follow-up. It was determined that the trailer is not licensed. Tim will follow-up about getting the trailer licensed.

Alpha groups are starting on Wednesdays. There are 60 people signed up.

Two Services planning: there were 251 people in service 9/8/24. The question was raised: do we need to start a second service earlier? The leadership team prayed about this and confirmed after the meeting via email/text communication that the church should move forward with two services in order to honor what God is doing.

• Station 19 Update; the contract is signed. A schedule for Workshop 1 was reviewed.

New Business

• Homeschool Club inquired if they could again meet at the church this year on Fridays. Emily motioned to pass. Tim seconded. Motion carried.

Community Sign. A quote was reviewed. Tim motioned to utilized what the youth raised plus \$110 rounding up to \$500. Jacob seconded. Motion passed. Josh will follow up with other churches.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 14th at 6 pm. Jacob will lead devotions and prayer.

Adjournment: Burt motioned to adjourn. Cindee seconded. Motion carried.
