LEADERSHIP MEETING

SEMI ANNUAL MEETING JULY 14, 2024

Call to Order. Lucas called the meeting to order at 11:22 a.m. on July 14, 2024. 69 people were present.

Opening Scripture and Prayer. Emily Johnson shared from Psalm 119:65-67 and Romans 15:13. Emily prayed.

Secretary Report. A few minutes were provided to review the Annual Meeting Minutes from January 2024. Aaron Spurrell motioned to accept as written. Bonnie Eastvold seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

Financial Report. A few minutes were provided to review. An increase in insurance was noted causing that line to be overbudget. There was an inquiry about some lines not having budget amounts. This was clarified that they were sublines under a larger budget line. Dirk Prindle made a motion to accept the financial report. Aaron Spurrell seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

Youth Report. Youth Pastor Josh Williamson shared that the youth had had a tubing day with East Lincoln with 50 youth and adults. Coming up are several activities such as Sr. High Camp, Lake Day at the Mohrlands, OneFest, MUUUCE to name a few. Planning for fall has already started. He asked for prayer for the team going to Chicago on a mission trip.

Leadership Team Highlights. Highlights were presented by Lucas Carlson. Highlights included: 1) launch of the Electronic Directory which has helped with the coordinating of various ministries; 2) provision of a well-attended CPR class; 3) commencing formation of an Emergency Response Team to include people with medical, safety, security, social work and other fields that will work together to assess and act if concerns arise 4) exploring the launch of a second service regarding which there was discussion stating that it was thought that removing the library was to help prevent that need to the concern that we have already lost some of our connectivity due to the number of people so hopefully two services will help with that. There was continued discussion that it is hard for one person to have 12 close friends and that one thing the leadership is looking at in addition to moving to two service is launching of small groups. A guestion was asked: how does Sunday School fit into that framework. Lucas responded that we don't have those answers. We have done some research. A member shared that they have been a part of churches that have had a second service Saturday night or other nights and it turned out that that grew the church because the alternate time allowed for people to come that maybe couldn't during a traditional timeframe. Lucas asked that the church keep the concept of two services in prayers as we "kick the tires" on the idea. He also shared who the members are of the leadership team and invited the congregation to feel free to approach any one of us with concerns, encouragement, questions or ideas.

New Business. Lucas shared that Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights are at capacity. He shared a personal story of how a decision from a generation before him positively

impacted and blessed him as he grew up in a church where he could invite his friends. He shared that during the last few months the Leadership Team (LT) had met with two different firms. The LT is recommending to the congregation that the church hire Station 19 as a next step toward possible building expansion. He explained that Station 19 serves 100% nonprofits of which 80 to 90% are churches. As an example, River Falls covenant church used Station 19 for their expansion. Station 19 offers a two-part process. There is no commitment to part 2 if we say yes to part 1. Part 1 includes:1) Workshop 1: "Visioning/Listening w/Staff and Key Leadership at church (one, 4 to 6 hour day) 2) Workshop #2: Vision to Serve People and Facility (includes site analysis, zoning, preliminary feasibility/ floor plan concepts, preliminary financial capability and more; 3) Workshop #3: Single preferred Direction (includes presentation of Design refinements of the Master Site and Floor Plan options, confirm prelim budget allowances and more; and 4) Schematic Design Drawings - For Contractor Preliminary Pricing. There are additional costs for travel and some optional visuals for 3D renderings. Lucas shared that the church has been saving \$5000.00/month for about a year and a half, so this is not something for which funds need to be raised. There was an inquiry about any wisdom gleaned from the prayer service held. Lucas and Emily shared that the leadership team reviewed any submitted cards and there was no clear message but felt that there was an agreement that space was needed. Some questions arose 1) is there a cap on the misc. fees 2) is there a time frame for deliverables 3) are we looking at just the worship space or space for youth or both. Lucas said we will get more information regarding the misc. fees. The timeframe may depend more on us as a church. In terms of which space, that is part of what Station 19 would help us figure out. Another question was inquired if references had been checked. The leadership team will follow-up by checking with additional churches who had used them. It was shared that one church member had experience with them and that though the overall building project didn't go well that was not on Station 19. Station 19 was super professional. He was encouraged that the process he has observed at this church is that God is still in charge of any expansion. Psalm 133 was share--how good and pleasant is it when God's people are in unity. Another question was raised inquiring as to what ratio of yes to nay will determine that the motion to go with Station 19 has passed. Jared Cockroft inquired if we were looking to vote today. Jared Cockroft made a motion to delay the vote until the references can be checked and answers obtained. Lynn Pickard seconded. Motion to delay the vote passed by a majority. There were at least two objections to the delay. It was discussed that the delay would be for at least two weeks. A vote may be scheduled for August 4th pending the timing of obtaining answers to the questions.

Pastor's Comments. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Pastor closed the meeting in prayer.

Adjournment: Mike Pickard made a motion to adjourn. Jim Mohrland seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
